In North Carolina, the state has reported more than 2,000 new cases of coronavirus for six days in a row, and it's possible that political rallies held over the weekend could push the numbers even higher. North Carolina set another record Friday, recording 2,908 cases in a single day.

Nationally COVID-19 cases hit a record 128,000 on Saturday, November 7. Many states reported the highest number of positive infections since the pandemic began, according to the Johns Hopkins University Coronavirus Resource Center. Saturday marked the fourth straight day new COVID-19 cases surpassed 100,000. In the past week, 715,000 people nationwide have tested positive for the virus.

Globally, Johns Hopkins University's coronavirus tracker reported more than 50.2 million COVID-19 cases worldwide as of Sunday, November 8, 2020. There have been more than 1.2 million deaths from the disease since the pandemic started.

The U.S. has approximately 4% of the world's population but represents almost a fifth of all reported COVID cases.
