

## Madison County Solid Waste Availability Fee Appeal Process

The Solid Waste Availability Fee is assessed annually by the Board of Commissioners in accordance with the Madison County Solid Waste Ordinance. Any Madison County property owner or business entity who wishes to dispute the assessment of the Solid Waste Availability Fee must do so by returning a completed Notice of Appeal Form to the Solid Waste Department by October 15th of each calendar year. The Notice of Appeal Form can be found on page 2 of this insert and must be mailed to: Madison County Solid Waste, 271 Craig Rudisill Road, Marshall, NC 28753.

Upon receipt of the appeal request, the Solid Waste Office shall have twenty (20) days to complete an inspection of the property for which the fee release is being requested. The property owner will be notified of the Department's decision regarding the request for release not more than ten (10) days after inspection.

Upon the issuance of the decision by the Solid Waste Department, any property owner or business entity who disagrees with the decision may contact the Solid Waste Department within seven (7) days to request a hearing to be held by the Solid Waste Appeals Board. The Solid Waste Department will schedule all hearings to be heard by the Appeals Board. Hearings will be conducted beginning the first Monday of November and concluding on the last Friday in December of each calendar year.
