## North Carolina COVID-19 Metrics

*North Carolina has relied on science, real-time data, and key metrics to guide its pandemic response. As we move into this next phase, some of those key metrics no longer meet the current need.*

*Beginning on March 23, 2022, the Summary page of the NCDHHS COVID-19 Dashboard Summary Page will be updated weekly on Wednesdays and will include Wastewater Surveillance, COVID-Like Illness in Emergency Departments, Hospital Admissions, COVID-19 Cases, Booster Rates, Prevalence of Variants, and CDC COVID-19 Community Levels data. In addition, the Dashboard will no longer include testing or contact tracing.*

*Updated Monday-Friday by the NC Department of Health and Human Services at approximately noon. Last updated 12:15 p.m., March 21, 2022.*

*Delays in laboratories reporting tests to NCDHHS may occur as laboratories are processing unprecedented numbers of COVID-19 tests.*
